21/11/2022	Respondent 1	I have read through the information, and at no point does it give you the catchment for the school that it refers to. Please could you make these details available.
		If the Admission Criteria changes will you also be free to change the catchment area?
		Trust Response:
		Thank you for your response to the consultation documents for the proposed admission changes at Reigate School from September 2024.
		I do not understand how you have not seen the proposed catchment area for Reigate School. This is detailed in the 'Catchment Area map' pdf file that we forwarded amongst the other documentation. It is also clear in all of the associated paperwork that this pertains to only Reigate School. I can only surmise that you mean Reigate School is not shown in lettering on the catchment map. This was not possible, as we had to use an ordnance survey map and could not alter it. It does however show the wording 'Sch' where Reigate School is located.
		In response to your other enquiry the answer is yes. Nothing has been confirmed for definite until after the Consultation.
		I hope this addresses your questions, but please do call me if this is not any clearer or if we have misunderstood your email.

20/01/2023	Respondent 3 (further response)	Further to our correspondence last week, please see below my comments on the proposed admission arrangements for Reigate School for September 2024 entry.
		As I have included my address in my consultation response, I would be grateful if my address were to be redacted from any publication of this comment.
		Thank you for advising that a home that falls underneath the purple line is deemed to be within the catchment area. However, the scale of the map showing the proposed catchment area means that it is tricky for me to determine whether our home falls within or outside of the catchment area; and I expect other applicants in similar positions may find the same.
		We live in XXXXXXXX (address removed at Respondent's request) - approximately half way along the road. You can see from the extract below (the red arrow points to XXXXXX) (map removed at Respondent's request) that as the purple line cuts the road in half, we would be unable to establish if our home is within or outside of the catchment area and so it would not be clear how an application would be considered. If a catchment area is to be introduced; then clarity for us would be provided if the boundary of the catchment area were to be extended to include the whole of this small road.

Furthermore, as XXXXXXX (address removed at Respondent's request) is a cul-de-sac, residents living at the northern end of the road are required to walk into the proposed catchment area at the southern end, prior to exiting XXXXXX. There is no other exit, pedestrian or otherwise, to the road. In addition to providing clarity to catchment boundaries as described above, if a catchment area is to be introduced it would therefore also seem logical and reasonable that the entire cul-de-sac be included within the catchment.
